Getting Started

- 1. What insight, principle, or observation from this week's message did you find to be most helpful, eye-opening or troubling? Explain.
- 2. If you were asked by a person unfamiliar with our "cultural" practice of Christmas. How would you describe it to them?
- 3. How does the cultural emphasis of Christmas rob the holiday of it's traditional (Biblical) meaning? How does this rob Christians of the joy of this season?
- 4. Read Acts 20:35. How does this verse challenge you as a Christian. What is a practical way to put this verse into practice?
- 5. Luke 1:6-7 reminds us that Godly people face challenges. How would this challenge have impacts Zachariah and Elizabeth? What does Elizabeth's statement in Luke 1:25 reveal?
- 6. Why is it importance that you walk blameless in all areas of your life? Think of the Christmas account. What kinds of people is God working through?
- 7. The angel reminds Zachariah that God has heard their prayer. Pastor shared how this is probably an old prayer request. How does the eternal nature of pray encourage us to pray?
- 8. Luke 1:14-15 reveal that God was concerned about how John would be raised. While the specifics only applied to John, it God concerned with how we raise our children? Why?
- 9. Luke 1:15-16. Compare with Malachi 4:5-6. How did John become a blessing to others?
