- 7. We don't often think of the good that comes from suffering. Can you think of an illustration from you own life that where suffering resulted in good for you or others?
- 8. There is no reason to endure unnecessary suffering. Yet, we can also focus to much on removing suffering. How might a person know when to accept what God is doing?
- 9. How does knowing there is a benefit to our suffering make it more endurable?
- 10. What stands out to you from the passage in Revelation?
