- 5. 2 Peter 1:20-21 gives us insight into how God gave us His Word. What insights to you notice in these verses?
- 6. God is very precise when He communicates. Read 1 Corinthians 2:12-13. How does God communicate with us? How does this fit with Jesus' teaching in Matthew 5:18?
- 7. Pastor covered 16 ways that the Bible is unique from any other writing in the history of man. Was there one way that stood out to you? If you had to pick one which would be the most compelling?
- 8. Pastor reviewed a chart comparing the manuscripts of the Bible with other ancient writings. What stood out to you from this chart? What does this say about the Bible?
- 9. Reflect again on Jesus' words in John 3:31-32. How should the information in this lesson impact your use of the Bible?
