2. I give to show my love for God in worship of Him.

"You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God."

2 Corinthians 9:11 ESV

3. I give as a tangible fulfillment of my responsibility to love other people, to help provide for their needs.

"Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." Hebrews 13:16 ESV

The Promise of Earthly Rewards

The Promise of Eternal Rewards

Four Types of Eternal Rewards 1. Verbal Recognition

"His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.'"

Matthew 25:21 ESV

2. Crowns

"Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that Day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved his appearing."

2 Timothy 4:8 ESV

3. Treasure

"Sell your possessions, and give to the needy. Provide yourselves with moneybags that do not grow old, with a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches and no moth destroys."

Luke 12:33 ESV

4. Positions of Authority

"if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he also will deny us;" 2 Timothy 2:12 ESV

"As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy.
