2. I Win over My Critics

"For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people." 1 Peter 2:15 ESV

3. I am Strengthened in Difficult Situations

"Servants, be subject to your masters with all respect, not only to the good and gentle but also to the unjust." I Peter 2:18 ESV

4. I am Giving My Struggles to Jesus

"For the wrongdoer will be paid back for the wrong he has done, and there is no partiality." Colossians 3:25 ESV

5. I am Making an Investment in Heaven

Four Practical Ways to Be a Leader at Work

1. Do My Job

"obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ," Ephesians 6:5 ESV

2. Work When No One is Watching Me

"not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart," Ephesians 6:6 ESV

3. Be Willing to Help (even when it is not my job)

"Bondservants are to be submissive to their own masters in everything; they are to be well-pleasing, not argumentative," Titus 2:9 ESV

4. Don't Steal

"not pilfering, but showing all good faith, so that in everything they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior." Titus 2:10 ESV

"Do you see a man skillful in his work? He will stand before kings; he will not stand before obscure men." Proverbs 22:29 ESV
