"In speaking of a new covenant, he makes the first one obsolete. And what is becoming obsolete and growing old is ready to vanish away."

Hebrews 9:4 ESV "Above it were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat. Of these things we cannot now speak in detail." Hebrews 9:5 ESV "These preparations having thus been made, the priests go regularly into the first section, performing their ritual duties," Hebrews 9:6 ESV "but into the second only the high priest goes, and he but once a year, and not without taking blood, which he offers for himself and for the unintentional sins of the people." Hebrews 9:7 ESV "And he shall take a censer full of coals of fire from the altar before the LORD, and two handfuls of sweet incense beaten small, and he shall bring it inside the veil and put the incense on the fire before the LORD, that the cloud of the incense may cover the mercy seat that is over the testimony, so that he does not die." Leviticus 16:12–13 ESV "By this the Holy Spirit indicates that the way into the holy places is

not yet opened as long as the first section is still standing"
