David's Struggle with Absalom?

"And the spirit of the king longed to go out to Absalom, because he was comforted about Amnon, since he was dead."

2 Samuel 13:39 ESV

"Now Joab the son of Zeruiah knew that the king's heart went out to Absalom." 2 Samuel 14:1 ESV

Absalom—Loved By the People

"Now in all Israel there was no one so much to be praised for his handsome appearance as Absalom. From the sole of his foot to the crown of his head there was no blemish in him."

Joab's Scheme

"And Joab sent to Tekoa and brought from there a wise woman and said to her, "Pretend to be a mourner and put on mourning garments. Do not anoint yourself with oil, but behave like a woman who has been mourning many days for the dead. Go to the king and speak thus to him." So Joab put the words in her mouth."

The Woman's Account

"And your servant had two sons, and they quarreled with one another in the field. There was no one to separate them, and one struck the other and killed him. And now the whole clan has risen against your servant, and they say, 'Give up the man who struck his brother, that we may put him to death for the life of his brother whom he killed.' And so they would destroy the heir also. Thus they would quench my coal that is left and leave to my husband neither name nor remnant on the face of the earth."" 2 Samuel 14:6–7 ESV

David's First Response

David's Second Response

King David Sees Through It

"Then the king answered the woman, "Do not hide from me anything I ask you." And the woman said, "Let my lord the king speak."" "The king said, "Is the hand of Joab with you in all this?" The woman answered and said, "As surely as you live, my lord the king, one cannot turn to the right hand or to the left from anything that my lord the king has said. It was your servant Joab who commanded me; it was he who put all these words in the mouth of your servant. In order to change the course of things your servant Joab did this. But my lord has wisdom like the wisdom of the angel of God to know all things that are on the earth.""

So Joab arose and went to Geshur and brought Absalom to Jerusalem. And the king said, "Let him dwell apart in his own house; he is not to come into my presence." So Absalom lived apart in his own house and did not come into the king's presence."
